### **U16 A CHAMPIONSHIP HURLING FINAL: PURCELL SHOOTS THE LIGHTS OUT IN MARINO!**

St. Vincents 3-22 Kilmacud Crokes 3-28 (After ET, 2-18 each at FT)

The young hurlers of St Vincent's and Kilmacud Crokes served up a magnificent afternoon of hurling yesterday at Pairc Naomh Uinseainn which played out for 93 minutes including injury time and extra time!

Seldom in Gaelic Games does a player equal his number of years in points scored; yesterday Kilmacud Crokes centre forward David Purcell went one better, amassing a total of 17!

Playing with home advantage, St Vincent's got into the pace of the game quicker and had registered 3 points in the 1<sup>st</sup> 3 minutes before Purcell settled Crokes' nerves with a fine effort from 45 metres.(KC 0-1 SV 0-3)

In a trend that was to recur in the 1<sup>st</sup> half, almost from the puck out, Vincent's were on the attack and accomplished midfielder Ronan Ó Néill stroked over from 50 metres. (KC 0-1 SV 0-4)

In the 8<sup>th</sup> minute, Purcell won possession in midfield and ran deep into the Vincent's danger zone; there was the possibility of a goal but he sensibly took his point. (KC 0-2 SV 0-4)

Half forward Sean McBarron almost got in on goal 2 minutes later but the Vincent's defence scrambled it out to the 45 metre line where Crokes roving corner forward Daragh O'Dwyer split the posts. (KC 0-3 SV 0-4)

Again Ó Néill replied for Vincent's from Ben Henry's puck out. Crokes goalie Conor Coogan quickly pucked out to McBarron on the right side line and he used the space in front of him before striking a lovely point from 45 metres. (KC 0-4 SV 0-5)

Ó Néill then sent a long free in which dipped sharply; Coogan took no chances and deflected it out for a 65 which Ó Neill despatched and then followed up with another to restore the 3 point lead. (KC 0-4 SV 0-7)

At times in the 1<sup>st</sup> half, it seemed as if Crokes were trying to hang onto Vincent's coat tails and their 1<sup>st</sup> touch wasn't as crisp as their opponents and they were getting blocked & hooked repeatedly. However from 19 – 22 minutes they played their best hurling of the half when wing back Max McBreen, midfielder Gearóid Flannery & Purcell all hit great points to level the match. (KC 0-7 SV 0-7)

Vincent's responded quickly to make it 0-9 to 0-7 and 2 minutes before ½ half came a moment which should have given Vincent's the momentum to push on. After a delay for an injury, Ó Néill drove a free from 65 metres and it dropped into the goal area and was lamely batted out to the edge of the square where a Vincent's forward smashed it into the goal. (KC 0-7 SV 1-9)

Purcell made a great catch from Coogan's puck out before being fouled and he pointed the free which was a good response but Vincent's finished with a point in injury time and as the teams ran into the dressing rooms, it seemed as if Crokes had a mountain to climb in the 2<sup>nd</sup> half.

HALF TIME KC 0-8 SV 1-8.

## 2<sup>ND</sup> HALF.

Crokes introduced u14/15 Rory Óg Flannery in the 2<sup>nd</sup> half in a "sweeper" type role and he hoovered up a ball in defence before finding Purcell who scored a sublime point from 65 metres on the left side line. Midfielder Oran O'Keefe made a marvellous catch from the puck out before feeding Purcell who stroked over another from 65 metres. On the 33<sup>rd</sup> minute, Purcell added his 3<sup>rd</sup> in a row from an acute angle on the 45 metre line and suddenly the gap was down to 3! (KC 0-11 SV 1-11)

Ó Néill hit back with a free before Flannery(the younger) hit a line ball into the left corner; Dwyer carried along the line before floating a high ball across the square and while the defence was watching, corner forward Paddy Clancy leapt into the air and batted the sliothar into the net on the right of the "small square"!

Purcell followed up with a point in the  $37^{th}$  minute and the 6 point deficit was wiped out! (KC 1-12 SV 1-12)

5 minutes later, Purcell was heading for goal but his shot was batted out to the right by Henry and the defence managed to clear it only as far as O'Keefe who put Crokes ahead for the  $1^{st}$  time in the match. (KC 1-13 SV 1-12)

Left half forward Riain Ó Murchú equalised 2 minutes later and then put Vincent's back into the lead on 48 minutes but the momentum had swung Crokes' way and following a schmozzle in the Vincent's goal, McBarron finished to the net to put Crokes 2 up. (KC 2-13 SV 1-14)

Ó Murchú pulled one back for Vincent's before Purcell gave a clever "pop pass" to Flannery(the elder) around the 65; Flannery intelligently ran into space and hit a lovely point from 50 metres. (KC 2-14 SV 1-15)

Crokes seemed to be in the driving seat now but were turned over while in attack and conceded a free on the 65. Ó Murchu sent a dangerous low trajectory ball into the "red zone" and it completely fooled the defence and goalkeeper and landed in the net. Crokes seemed a bit shell shocked by this and Ó Murchú followed up with free a minute later. (KC 2-14 SV 2-16)

Coogan pucked out quickly to Flannery and he found Purcell who reduced the deficit and then McBarron equalised. (KC 2-16 SV 2-16)

In the final minute of normal time, Purcell "surfed" 2 high tackles before getting the free which he nailed from 50 metres but Ó Néill equalised in the 64<sup>th</sup> minute. Coogan found Purcell with a quick puck out and he was hit by a few heavy challenges before being harshly penalised for over carrying. Ó Néill put his side ahead from 65 metres and with the game 6 minutes into injury time, it seemed that that harsh call was going to decide the match.

Purcell, however, had other ideas and having gained possession deep into injury time he once more showed great composure to hit the equaliser from play. Of all of his 17 points, this was the most important as the final whistle just after.

# **FULL TIME KC 2-18 SV 2-18.**

At this stage it was raining heavily and dark as the saturated players went to the shelter of the dressing rooms.

### **EXTRA TIME**

Vincent's got the better start with 2 points before Coogan found O'Keefe with a good puck out and he fed Purcell who landed it from 60 metres before following up with yet another equaliser on 5 minutes. (KC 2-20 SV 2-20)

Purcell and Flannery then added 2 more points before Ó Murchú pulled one back. Clancy completed the scoring of the 1<sup>st</sup> period to leave Crokes 2 up and looking comfortable. (KC 2-23 SV 2-21)

Crokes stretched the lead to 3 when McBarron fed Purcell and he landed another.

At this point Crokes were in complete control but over complicated things while working the sliothar upfield and were turned over in midfield – Vincent's quickly moved the ball to Ó Murchú and he soloed powerfully as if the "Red Sea had opened" in front of him before rifling into the top right corner from 14 metres! (KC 2-24 SV 3-21)

Once more it was on a knife edge and once more Purcell restored the lead for Crokes before Vincent's drew level again. (KC 2-25 SV 3-22)

With less than 5 minutes remaining, Crokes' tigerish wing back Max McBreen did well to gather "dirty ball" before being fouled and Flannery Óg sent a long range free into the box where it was scrambled out to the right but Dwyer gathered and hit a lovely point "over the shoulder" from 35 metres. (KC 2-26 SV 3-22)

At this stage Vincent's were throwing the sink at Crokes in search of an equaliser but the defence in which full back line of Danny O'Sullivan, James Neary, Cathal Crean & centre back James Dunphy were dogged, stood firm.

After repelling an attack, the sliothar was worked up field to Gearóid Flannery who shot from 45 metres; it looked as if it would drop just over the bar and Vincent's goalie Henry made a valiant effort to stop it but was most unfortunate to deflect it over his own line. (KC 3-26 SV 3-22)

Henry tried to find a team mate with a quick puck out but vigilant Crokes u15 sub Finnian Donohoe intercepted and tapped over to make it a 5 point differential. (KC 2-27 SV 3-22)

At this stage the life was sucked out of Vincent's and the game finished minutes later with, (who else), Purcell scoring his 17<sup>th</sup> point from a free.

As always on these occasions there was elation and desolation in equal measure for winners and losers respectively.
